**RESOLUTION TO OPT BACK IN TO OPIOIDS SETTLEMENT**  
**PURSUANT TO INDIANA CODE 4-6-15-2**

**WHEREAS**, Tippecanoe County has been actively engaged in pursuing damages caused by the manufacture, sale, and distribution of opioids through outside counsel in multidistrict litigation; and

**WHEREAS**, recent legislation amending Indiana Code 4-6-15 has been adopted by the Indiana legislature and signed into law by the Governor; and

**WHEREAS**, Tippecanoe County, Indiana, after due consideration of said legislation, has determined that it is in the best interest of its citizens to opt back into the opioids settlements under Indiana Code 4-6-15-2.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by Tippecanoe County, Indiana by and through its Board of Commissioners, having considered whether to elect to opt back into the opioids settlements under Indiana Code 4-6-15-2, that Tippecanoe County now exercises its election to opt back in to the opioid settlements and orders its duly authorized agent to submit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Indiana Attorney General by July 15, 2022.
