



What is the **WeTip** School Safety Hotline?

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As a member of WeTip's School Safety Program, the district receives:

Access to the toll-free, 24-hour hotline, open seven days a week and answered by trained operators. Students can anonymously report wrong doing and potential violence and remain absolutely anonymous. A Spanish speaking operator is available on each shift.

Immediate notification of tips received

WeTip is a safe and effective hotline that employs skilled operators to take information on tip forms that have been developed with the help of law enforcement to obtain the maximum amount of critical information.

Student awareness public service videos and audio messages for schools

Appropriate posters, brochures, and school safety stickers are provided to the district as an informational reminder of the WeTip anonymous hotline solution.

School safety communication tools designed to work within your existing internal procedures

WeTip provides professional adult consultation seminars and youth participation workshops for implementing and using the WeTip School Safety Program.

How is WeTip working to keep our schools safe?

WeTip is working to address the root causes of violence and crime among students. Toward that end, we are sharing effective strategies to:

- ✓ Reduce and eliminate threats, bullying, harassment, vandalism and weapons on campus.
- ✓ Reduce risk and loss to school districts caused by malicious activity, property destruction and arson.
- ✓ Provide a way for students, teachers and district staff to communicate information about problem situations on campus anonymously and without fear of reprisal or retaliation
- ✓ Develop an emergency plan that includes the WeTip Hotline for reporting any type of threat or crime situation BEFORE it happens.
- ✓ Through WeTip's Save Our Schools Program, WeTip works with thousands of schools nationwide to create a safe and secure learning environment for all students that is free of crime and threats. WeTip is a clearinghouse on school safety, providing the nationwide anonymous hotline, reward payments, training for students, teachers, administrators and SRO's.
