

TIPPECANOE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING
January 4, 2016

The Tippecanoe County Commissioners met on Monday, January 4, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. in the Tippecanoe Room in the County Office Building. Commissioners present were: President Thomas P. Murtaugh, Vice President David S. Byers, and Commissioner Tracy A. Brown. Also present were: Attorney Doug Masson, Auditor Bob Plantenga, Commissioners' Assistant Paula Bennett, and Recording Secretary Tillie Hennigar.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

RESOLUTION 2016-03-CM – MODIFYING THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCOME TAX CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Attorney Masson said the County has an Economic Development Income Tax Capital Improvement Plan which is necessary to spend money from the Economic Development Income Tax (EDIT). It began years ago when the uses of the funds were more limited. Over the years, legislature has expanded the uses for which EDIT can be spent. The Resolution modifies the plan to add new projects and provide additional funding for existing projects. The new projects are numbers 88 through 96:

RESOLUTION 2016-04-CM – AMENDING THE CUMULATIVE CAPITAL TAX IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Attorney Masson said Resolution 2016-04-CM adds two new projects: 1) Project III - 111 N. 4th Street Building Repair and Renovation with an estimated project cost of \$370,000 and 2) Project JJJ – Capital Outlay Expenditures for Calendar Year 2016 with an estimated project cost of \$733,020. The Board of Commissioners also approved the following previously established projects:

CONTRACT FOR ATTORNEY

Attorney Masson presented and recommended the 2016 Attorney Contract for Hoffman, Luhman & Masson, PC, stating the agreement terms remain the same as the past couple of years. He added that he appreciates the opportunity to serve the County, saying it is a very gratifying undertaking.

President Byers summarized the service fees per hour as \$185.00 per hour for David W. Luhman and Douglas J. Masson; \$165.00 per hour for Matthew A. Salsbery or other principals of the firm; \$145.00 per hour for associates of the firm; and \$75.00 per hour for paralegals.

- Commissioner Brown moved to approve the Contract for Hoffman, Luhman & Masson as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh; motion carried.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the meeting minutes from December 21, 2015 as presented, second by Commissioner Brown; motion carried.

APPROVAL OF CONTRACTS

Courthouse Construction Management Contract with Kettlehut Construction

President Byers said there are two Contracts to begin work on the Courthouse Dome and Roof. The first one is from Kettlehut Construction in the amount of \$99,300.

- Commissioner Brown moved to approve the contract for Kettlehut Construction in the amount of \$99,300 as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh; motion carried.

Courthouse Architect Contract with ARSEE Engineering

Attorney Masson said the main form of the contract is acceptable; however, there is one issue regarding mandatory binding arbitration and what to do in the case of a conflict. His recommendation is to go to court under those circumstances. Also, the contract requires some additional terms and conditions such as the e-verify provision and the Iran disclaimer, both required by the State. He recommended approval of the contract subject to the changes recommended by the County Attorney. Providing those changes are made by ARSEE, authorize the President to sign on behalf of the Board of Commissioners.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the contract for ARSEE Engineering in the amount of \$150,000 subject to the changes recommended by the County Attorney, second by Commissioner Brown; motion carried.

AREA PLAN COMMISSION – Sallie Fahey

Subdivision Variance – S4557 Fieldstone Subdivision (Major Preliminary Plat)

Area Plan Commission Director Fahey requested approval for a variance from the required 100 foot roadway tangent in Fieldstone Subdivision for the intersection of Streets G and D. Director Fahey said Highway Director Kuhl does not have a problem with the variance. In order for the Plan Commission to approve (or deny), a recommendation of approval must be made by the Commissioners. If denied by the Commissioners, the Plan Commission must also deny.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve Subdivision Variance S4557 for Fieldstone Subdivision as presented, second by Commissioner Brown; motion carried.

Application for EMPG District Exercise Grant

Indiana Department of Homeland Security (IDHS) District 4 Coordinator Houston requested permission to apply for a \$70,000 EMPG Exercise Grant. The grant would be for the Task Force to return to Muscatatuk in September. The amount is 100% reimbursable by IDHS.

- Commissioner Brown moved to approve permission to apply for the \$70,000 EMPG grant as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh; motion carried.
