MEETING MINUTES

TUESDAY, October 9, 2018

8:30 a.m.

Councilmembers present: President John Basham, Vice President Bryan Metzger, Kevin Underwood, David R. Williams, Vicki Burch, and Kathy Vernon. Roland Winger was absent.

Others present: Attorney Doug Masson, Auditor Robert A. Plantenga and Recording Secretary John Thomas

I. Call to Order and the Pledge of Allegiance

President Basham called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Auditor's Financial Report – Bob Plantenga presented:

The 2018 Financial Statement shows a General Fund beginning cash balance of \$10,222,106.09. The projected miscellaneous revenue and property taxes (with deductions for the circuit breakers) leaves the total funds available at \$57,565,593.09. When deducting encumbrances, the 2018 Budget, adding back in 3% for the estimated unused budget and the minimum balances established by Council the beginning net balance is \$1,641,827.09.

So far this year Council has granted additional appropriations of \$672,443 and today's additional requests total \$67,050. Budget reductions so far this year total \$170,382. There have been Miscellaneous Expenditures of \$873.08, which leaves a current balance of \$1,138,893.01.

The revenues report shows a special distribution into the Local Income Tax (LIT) and because of that the line item will ultimately exceed 100% this year. There were no other noteworthy revenues this month.

The fund balances show: 1) the General Fund (1000) is at \$4,945,000 which is less than the minimum balance but we are holding property tax money there; 2) the Parking Garage Fund (4017) has a healthy cash balance is about \$530,000, and we anticipate some additional expenses as the garage ages; 3) the Self Insurance Fund (4710) took in more than went out (\$842,000 and \$620,000 respectively) has a cash balance over \$5.3 million in addition to the Health Insurance Rainy Day Fund of \$3 million.

III. Treasurer's Report – Jennifer Weston presented:

The Account Balances and Interest Rates report was distributed and includes for the first time the 2018 Fairgrounds Bond sale at Lafayette Bank and Trust. The interest rates did increase another quarter percent on September 26 so that will be reflected next month. Total interest for the month of September was \$116,234.84 with the year-to-year comparison typical for this time of the year. The distributions for the the Fairgrounds Fund (4818) are shown for the first time. The General fund year-to-date interest is \$717,127.48. The interest projection has been increased to reflect the rise in the rate.

V. Presentation – Fairfield Trustee Julie Roush and State Representative Don Lehe

Representative Lehe stated that the Governor's Office recently created an honorary award called the Circle of Corydon (similar to the Sagamore of the Wabash) to recognize individuals for their contribution to a local community and called Bill Jones to the podium. Trustee Roush summarized Mr. Jones contribution to local governments and Representative Lehe awarded the Circle of Corydon to Mr. Bill Jones.

VI. Resolution 2018-34-CL for the Tippecanoe County Public Library – Jos Holman

- Councilmember Williams moved to approve **Resolution 2018-34-CL** approving the Library issuance of bonds, second by Councilmember Burch.

Mr. Holman distributed a rendering of the branch libraries and stated they want to continue expanding library services by building a new 14,000 square foot branch at Concord and 18th Streets. The cost is estimated to be \$4.5 Million with a 10-year bond. The libraries debt is low, less than \$2 million and has engaged Kettlehut and KJG for the project. There will be a Story Walk that tells a story along a path around the site.

President Basham ask if there were any further questions. Hearing none he called for the vote. Motion carried.
