## Introduction:

The following information is a printout of the cemetery database developed by the Area Plan Commission of Tippecanoe County after a land use study conducted in 1988-1989. The information gathered on property owners and Auditors key numbers was current at that time. Updated information has been added and files corrected as errors or new information becomes available and known to Area Plan. Books holding referenced deeds, maps, aerials, photos, surveys and additional information are available to the public in the Area Plan Commission office at 20 North 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, Lafayette Indiana 47901-1266. Telephone 765-423-9242. Hours 8 am to 4:30 pm EST.

The included 133 sites have been documented by verifiable public information as referenced. There are estimated to be at least 30 to 40 other cemetery sites in Tippecanoe County that are not verifiable. It is estimated that Tippecanoe County has approximately 200 cemeteries.

Database records have the following fields:

Name = common name used at time of study (1988)

AKA = other names also used to describe above cemetery

Caretaker = This field was current in 1989, partially updated in 1992, only briefly updated since that time.

Civil Township = Tippecanoe County has 13 civil townships by name

Section/township/range = location by Indiana survey standards (American)

Owners = This field was current in 1989 and has not been updated unless a specific cemetery has been researched separately.

Key numbers = Auditors Office parcel key numbers as of 1989

Topo = Topographical information usually listed by United States Geographical Survey or private survey. On rare occasions, site information.

Verified = How the Area Plan Commission verified this cemetery

Books = Any books written on this cemetery

Maps = Any specific maps that show the existence of this cemetery

Sources = Sources of information for this database

History = Common history of cemetery or listing of family surnames

TCHA Info = Information from the Tippecanoe County Historical Association

ISHA Interim Report = Information from the Indiana State Historical Association Interim Report with code numbers

Surveys = All known surveys of part, whole or adjacent cemetery property

Deeds = All known deeds or exception on deed references, most are series of additions and few are deeds for whole cemeteries

Veterans = While all cemeteries probably contain some Veteran, this list is for Revolutionary War Veterans, Civil War Veterans or others as known

Misc = This field contains a variety of information as gathered or gleamed

Condition = This field will list any condition found by the staff members of the Area Plan Commission on a given date. Later, earlier or present conditions not given

Description = This field lists any descriptive value, usually general location

Extras = Reports from the public since 1988 or Area Plan Commission visits

Religious Affiliation = This field tells of any specific religious affiliation

Directions = All directions given are from the central point of the Tippecanoe County Courthouse and use main roads.

Trivia = This field relates date of earliest burial available and are only approximate as to the verifiable record.

Aerials = If aerial photographs are available in Area Plan Cemetery Books

Photos = If taken or donated photographs of a specific cemetery are available in the Area Plan Cemetery Books

Plats = If cemetery plats are available in the Area Plan Cemetery Books

Deed Research = If the Area Plan Commission staff has done deed research on a specific cemetery

Indiana Pioneer = If the cemetery has a verifiable burial before 1850.

The Tippecanoe County Area Plan Commission is not responsible for errors or discrepancies in this database, as all information gathered is gleaned from public informational sources. Permission must be sought from property owner or property owner of land transversed to visit cemeteries that are not generally open to the public.

Database information is taken from the Area Plan Cemetery Books kept in the Area Plan Commission Office. Additional information may be included in specific books that do not show in database. Multiple names of some cemeteries used by different sources have created confusion, and great care has been given to distinguish specific sites. With the exception of 11 sites that were deemed unreachable, staff members of the Area Plan Commission have visited all cemetery sites included in this database.

# INDIANA'S CEMETERY AND BURIAL GROUNDS REGISTRY

Both historic cemeteries and pre-contact burial areas are located in Indiana. They are part of our cultural landscape in which more and more citizens are becoming interested. Indiana Code 14-21-1-13.5 authorized the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology (DHPA) to create a registry of all cemeteries and burial grounds in Indiana.



The DHPA is creating the statewide cemetery registry to help know the local of as many cemeteries as possible to help provide better protection of these resources. The DHPA will be the lead agency for the creation of the registry.

The registry will involve coordination with agencies and organizations such as: historical societies, museums, genealogical groups, archaeologists, and private individuals. Many groups and individuals have already compiled great amounts of resources regarding cemeteries, and through partnerships, we will bring together everyone's information into the statewide registry.

The immense, advanced, and complex scope of this project is a challenge which the DHPA welcomes, given its, and the public's strong interest in protecting and preserving these important resources. Our state will join a growing number of states that have taken on the task of compiling information about the cemeteries within their borders. This project will help to insure that future Hoosiers will have a wealth of information to draw upon regarding the location of the resting places of those who have gone before.

The DHPA is committed to helping increase public awareness regarding these sties and their importance. We have a cemetery question and answer sheet that is available free of charge form our office or can be found on our webpage. Look for further cemetery information and publications in the future.
