**II. RESOLUTION T 2020-03: RESOLUTIONS TO AMEND THE FY 2020-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)**

**Replace Old US 231 Bridge over Wea Creek;**

Doug Poad said the first request from Tippecanoe County is to replace a bridge on Old US 231 South just south of Veteran's Memorial Parkway. This will use Group IV STP funding. Construction is targeted for FY 2024 and the County will be using local funds for PE and any right-of-way needed. Preliminary engineering is anticipated to begin in FY 2021. The total amount of federal funds awarded was \$240,000 for construction engineering and \$1,920,000 for construction.

**For CityBus: add \$1,000,000 from MACOG in CY 18 Section 5307 funds; carry over \$349,105 in CY 19 Section 5310 funds; carry over \$48,000 in CY Section 5307 funds: update CY 20 list of projects**

Doug Poad said this request is from CityBus. This is a standard request that is done yearly to revisit operating capital and planning projects to make changes. For operating assistance, they are planning on using more federal funds than anticipated, which will reduce the local match. For capital projects, CityBus is looking to reduce the funding for bus replacement. They will be replacing two buses instead of three. The other project in the TIP that will be changing is the funds needed for a support vehicle. Some funds have been added to the pedestrian and bicycle detection system project. The first planning project is hiring an engineering company to create the plans to increase the size of the CNG station. The second planning project is completing phase 2 of their strategic plan. Additionally, route planning software will be added to the TIP and will use about \$36,000 of STBG funds. The Board of Directors and Technical Transportation Committee have reviewed this amendment and recommended approval.

**III. RESOLUTION T 2020-04: RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE FY 2020-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)**

**Construct ADA ramps on SR 38; 10 bridge work locations; asphalt overlay on US 231; traffic signal modernization at Sagamore Pky W and Cumberland Ave; shrub windbreak along N 100 W; widening I-65 from Wabash River bridge to 1 mile north of SR 43**

Doug Poad said this is a request from the INDOT District office. There is one project in the TIP that adds preliminary engineering using federal funds. This project is located on SR 38 to construct ADA ramps. The other projects are new. Nine of these are related to bridge maintenance and are located on SR 25, SR 38, US 52, and US 231, respectively. Construction dates vary from FY 2022 to FY 2024. One project is an

asphalt preventative maintenance project on US 231 south of SR 28 with an estimated construction date of FY 2024. Another project is a district-wide signal modernization with one signal in Tippecanoe County located at Sagamore Parkway and Cumberland, with an estimated construction date of FY 2022. On I-65 north of SR 43, a landscape windbreak project has been added to reduce extra plow trips and reduce the number of crashes from blowing snow. This has an estimated construction date of FY 2022. The last project involves additional widening on I-65. This will begin where the Wabash River widening project ends (approximately one mile north of SR 43) with construction starting in FY 2022. The Technical Transportation Committee has reviewed this amendment and recommended approval.

**IV. APC PROGRESS REPORT  
MPO Update**

Sallie Fahey said on May 20, 2020, a modification to the FY 2020-2024 TIP was made to move Wabash Center's low floor mini-van project from Table 5, Unfunded Local Projects, to Table 4, Funded Local Projects. Wabash Center's funding request was approved by INDOT. The funds will be used to purchase three low-floor mini vans. The project cost is \$136,809 with a federal match of \$109,448. On June 11, 2020, a modification to move \$104,198 of STBG funds to the CityBus was made to the FY 2020- 2024 TIP. This will be used for the shelter and sidewalk project as well as the software project. This funding was transferred from the Yeager Road, Twyckenham Boulevard, Concord Road and Yost Drive projects.

Sallie Fahey said she attended a virtual conference on Monday and Tuesday. The House Reauthorization Bill and the Senate Bill were discussed. The Senate Bill was developed in a bipartisan manner. The House Bill was developed in a partisan manner and is called INVEST in America Act. INVEST stands for Investing in a New Vision for the Environment and Service Transportation. This is funded at a higher level than any previous bill at \$494 billion over five years. The first part of the bill is a one-year extension of the FAST Act so there is no new policy associated with it. Additional STBG and administrative MPO expenses may be a by-product of this extension. Part two of the bill is the reauthorization for four years which will increase STBG funding. They are proposing to change the name of STBG funding to STP, which was the previous name for that type of funding. There is also additional funding for planning, but this proposal will require two more planning performance measures for states to monitor (accessibility and climate).

**INDOT 18-Month Letting List**

Doug Poad said the letting list has grown substantially. The new projects are mainly INDOT maintenance projects. The bid letting results show that two bridge deck overlay projects on SR 225 were awarded to Milestone Contractors for \$2,438,456. The district-wide project on the letting list includes a few bridges in Tippecanoe County. A TIP amendment regarding this project will be done next month. Project 44 on the letting list is no longer listed.

Jackson Bogan asked what it means when the project does not show.  
Doug Poad said it was not included in the list on the INDOT website.

## **V. MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT**

Doug Poad said the report in the packet lists the funds that have been obligated through INDOT. The table summarizes the funding. There were some differences in funding types because certain funds are obligated in a different way in INDOT's system. The balances on a few of the projects will be transferred to CityBus for the projects discussed earlier.

## **VI. QUARTERLY REPORTS**

### **Tippecanoe County Klondike Road**

Tim Stroshine said there was a cost increase of about \$90,000 due to change orders.

### **Lindberg**

Tim Stroshine said this project will require federal funding for coordination with KB&S Railroad. This funding will be used before the end of this calendar year.

### **North River Road at River Bend Hospital**

Tim Stroshine said this road has reopened. INDOT has signed off on final close out.

### **River Road at CR 500N**

Tim Stroshine said this project had a delay in the purchase of right-of-way because some parcels went to condemnation.

### **Concord at CR 430S**

Tim Stroshine said this project is almost ready and close to receiving final field check acceptance.

### **Morehouse Road Reconstruction**

Tim Stroshine said this project may have to split into multiple construction phases, depending on the construction cost.

### **Lafayette**

#### **Park East Boulevard Extension**

Tim Stroshine said this project had issues with the purpose and need statement in the environmental document. Staff was able to have a conference call with Lafayette City Engineer to work out this problem.

Sallie Fahey said the consulting firm working on the environmental report was getting concerns from INDOT about whether one section of the project had independent utility. Staff had a conversation with an INDOT reviewer to explain the value of the project from SR 26 to SR 38. This project is moving ahead again. The take away from this issue is that LPAs need to be aware of what their consulting firm is sending to INDOT, and to make sure they are giving them enough information.

### **West Lafayette**

#### **Cherry Lane Extension**

Tim Stroshine said this project is almost complete.

## Happy Hollow Neighborhood Trail

Tim Stroshine said this project is almost complete as well. There is only a purchase order that needs to be closed out.

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**FY 2020-2024 TIP Amendment  
Area Plan Commission, Area IV & INDOT**

**Staff Report  
July 1, 2020**

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**BACKGROUND AND REQUEST:**

There are three requests in this amendment. The first request addresses funding changes to FY 2021 Federal Funding as a result of the final FY 2020 sharing agreement with INDOT. The second request involves adding Area IV's rural van service. Finally, the INDOT district office requested changes to several projects.

Update FY 2021 Federal Funding

On February 27, 2020, INDOT distributed the FY 2020 final sharing agreement. It shows that the final amount of federal funds our area received is \$4,963,170. This is slightly less than what was programmed in the TIP (\$4,977,402). INDOT will not have us revisit our project obligations for FY 2020. The difference, \$14,232, will instead be deducted from our FY 2021 allocation. The following table summarizes the funding information.

In order to maintain a financially constrained TIP, the following changes need to be made:

STBG Federal Funds

The funding for the Park East Boulevard project will be reduced by \$3,872 in federal funds. Construction is currently programmed at \$1,495,052 in STBG Federal funds, and the new amount will be \$1,491,180.

HSIP and Section 164 Federal funds

The funding for the North River Road project will be reduced by \$10,915 in federal funds. Construction is currently programmed at \$2,218,207 in safety funds, and the new amount will be \$2,207,292.

TA Federal funds

The funding for the Lindberg Road project will be increased by \$555 in federal funding. Funding is currently programmed at \$213,774 in TA Federal funds, and the new amount will be \$214,329.

Area IV Council on Aging Section 5311 Service

Area IV is now providing an expanded transportation service within Tippecanoe County. The service is a demand-response system that serves residents who live outside of the Census-defined urbanized area. This service is open to public, so anyone can use it. The cost is \$5.00 per person for a one-way trip. If the person is 60 or older, Area IV only asks for a donation. Service is provided Monday through Friday and between the hours of 8:30 AM and 4:30 PM.

This service is part of the Federal Transit Administration’s Section 5311 program, which targets transportation in rural areas. Federal funds are available for capital, planning and operating assistance. Due to INDOT’s eligibility requirements, only certain agencies are eligible to receive these funds. For this service, the recipient is Tippecanoe County, and funds are then given to Area IV.

Because Federal funds are being used, the service is required to be in the TIP. The following table provides detailed information:

**INDOT**

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The district office requested several changes to the TIP, which include deleting two projects, changing the scope and funding of one project, and programming two new projects.

The TIP currently shows several bridge deck patching projects on I-65 which are located just south of SR 43 (des #'s 1901585 and 1901580). Both projects have been added into a district-wide maintenance project, so they no longer need to be shown separately in the TIP.

One project, des #1901578, is also currently shown in the TIP as a bridge maintenance and repair project on I-65 just south of SR 43. The scope of this project has changed from a specific location to district-wide project and the improvements will occur at various locations. The project was let this past May, and INDOT has added a contract option for a second year, FY 2021.

Project des #1901576 is a new project and very similar to the one just mentioned. It is also a district-wide bridge maintenance project. The project was let this past May, and INDOT has added a contract option for a second year, FY 2021.

Finally, the last project is a district-wide maintenance pavement project, which will be let in FY 2021.
