Commissioners present President Tracy A. Brown, Vice President Thomas P. Murtaugh and Member David S. Byers.

Also present: Attorney Doug Masson, Auditor Robert Plantenga, Commissioners' Assistant Paula Bennett, and Recording Secretary Jennifer Wafford.

- I. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE** – President Brown called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance
- II. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** from Monday, July 6, 2020.
 - Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the minutes as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.
- III. **PRESENTATION OF ACCOUNTS PAYABLE** – Paula Bennett

The claims from July 10, 2020 through July 20, 2020 were recommended for approval without exception.

 - Commissioner Byers moved to approve the Accounts Payable as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh. Motion carried.
- IV. **PRESENTATION OF PAYROLL** – Paula Bennett

The payroll from July 10, 2020 was recommended for approval without exception.

 - Commissioner Byers moved to approve the Payroll as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh. Motion carried.
- V. **HIGHWAY** – Stewart Kline presented and recommended:
 - A. Street Acceptance for Avalon Bluff, Section Three, Phase One Subdivision for the following: Gawain Drive for 1,393.34 feet, Chivalry Drive for 1,010.15 feet, Dodson Drive for 123.10 feet, and Langhorn Trail for 1,220.22 feet. Additionally, a three-year maintenance bond for Atlas Excavating Inc., in the amount of \$89,728.40 and, a three-year maintenance bond for Milestone Contractors LP, in the amount of \$42,540.
 - Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the street acceptance and maintenance bonds as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.
 - B. Right-of-Way Performance and Completion Blanket Bond for Indiana Fiber Network dba Intelligent Fiber Network for \$5,000 to work in all County right-of-way. The bond replaces existing bond #LSM1231388.
 - Commissioner Byers moved to approve the bond as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh. Motion carried.
- VI. **WIC** – Alicia Keen presented and recommended:

Memorandum of Understanding with Franciscan Health Lafayette for 2020-2022 will allow WIC to continue services and see clients at St. Elizabeth East Hospital.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the agreement as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

VII. AGREEMENT WITH FIREEYE, INC. – Doug Masson presented and recommended:

Non-Disclosure Agreement with Fire Eye, Inc. in addition to the agreement already in place from December 2019. Fire Eye, Inc. is the State-approved vendor to provide election security to Indiana counties. The NDA agreement is needed because the vendor will have access to the Tippecanoe County network infrastructure information as part of its services.

- Commissioner Byers moved to approve the agreement as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh. Motion carried.

VIII. HUMAN RESOURCES – Shirley Mennen

A. Professional Services Agreement with ProActive MD for a Back-to-Work safety program for returning after COVID-19. This is a no-charge agreement and requires approval by the Commissioners.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the agreement as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

B. Prosecutor is requesting a new position for Adult Protective Services for an “APS Investigator” (PAT III). The APS Grant FY 2020-2021 has already been approved, but the position needs to be created.

Commissioner Byers moved to approve the “APS Investigator” position as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh. Motion carried.

C. Sheriff’s office is requesting 2 “Merit Deputies” for School Resource Officer positions. One resource officer would be stationed Full-Time at McCutcheon High School, and the other resource officer would be stationed Full-Time at Harrison High School.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the (2) “Merit Deputy” positions as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

IX. GRANTS – Sharon Hutchison presented and recommended:

Permission to Accept Grants funds:

Health Department for the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) FY 2021 Grant from Indiana State Department of Health for \$31,895 from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The Grant comes with specific activities aimed at enhancing state and local preparedness in order to better respond to public health and healthcare emergencies, such as COVID-19.

- Commissioner Byers moved to accept the grant as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh. Motion carried.

MOU/Contract:

For Cary Home Youth Services with Mark Roberts for Law Enforcement Community Engagement, not to exceed \$10,080 between July 1, 2020, and June 30, 2021.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the contract as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

Memorandum of Understanding for the Sheriff's Office with Lafayette Police Department for FY 2020 Local JAG funding of \$5,851.

- Commissioner Byers moved to approve the contract as presented, second by Commissioner Murtaugh. Motion carried.

X. RESOLUTION 2020-26-CM - Authorizing Petition to Establish a Regional Sewer District for Americus, Buck Creek, and Colburn.

This Resolution is authorizing Commissioner Brown to submit a Petition to Establish a Regional Sewer District for Americus, Buck Creek, and Colburn. Commissioner Brown was designated by the Tippecanoe County Council as the individual to submit the Petition. There was a public hearing in June on this Petition. The approval of this Resolution is the last step in the process and will show the Commissioner's support for the filing of this Petition.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve Resolution 2020-26-CM, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

XI. CHANGE ORDERS FOR COURTHOUSE COURTROOM PROJECT

Change order #2 for Brand Tech to add a video input system from the Judge's bench for displaying virtual meetings, in the amount of \$7,520.00.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the change orders as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

Change order #1 for Quality Plumbing and Heating to provide and install a new roof exhaust and ducting for new restrooms on the 4th and 5th floor. This change order will also provide new roof curb and necessary patching to maintain roof warranty and change the ductwork for Juvenile Magistrate courtroom, in the amount of \$21,240.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the change orders as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

Change order #1 for Brand Electric for work associated with changes and additions in the 4th floor Magistrate courtroom and also add track lighting above the bench, in the amount of \$5,550.

- Commissioner Murtaugh moved to approve the change orders as presented, second by Commissioner Byers. Motion carried.

§ 1 The Contractor and Surety, jointly and severally, bind themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns to the Owner to pay for labor, materials and equipment furnished for use in the performance of the Construction Contract, which is incorporated herein by reference, subject to the following terms.

§ 2 If the Contractor promptly makes payment of all sums due to Claimants, and defends, indemnifies and holds harmless the Owner from claims, demands, liens or suits by any person or entity seeking payment for labor, materials or equipment furnished for use in the performance of the Construction Contract, then the Surety and the Contractor shall have no obligation under this Bond.

§ 3 If there is no Owner Default under the Construction Contract, the Surety's obligation to the Owner under this Bond shall arise after the Owner has promptly notified the Contractor and the Surety (at the address described in Section 13) of claims, demands, liens or suits against the Owner or the Owner's property by any person or entity seeking payment for labor, materials or equipment furnished for use in the performance of the Construction Contract and tendered defense of such claims, demands, liens or suits to the Contractor and the Surety.

§ 4 When the Owner has satisfied the conditions in Section 3, the Surety shall promptly and at the Surety's expense defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Owner against a duly tendered claim, demand, lien or suit.

§ 5 The Surety's obligations to a Claimant under this Bond shall arise after the following:

§ 5.1 Claimants, who do not have a direct contract with the Contractor,

- .1 have furnished a written notice of non-payment to the Contractor, stating with substantial accuracy the amount claimed and the name of the party to whom the materials were, or equipment was, furnished or supplied or for whom the labor was done or performed, within ninety (90) days after having last performed labor or last furnished materials or equipment included in the Claim; and
- .2 have sent a Claim to the Surety (at the address described in Section 13).

§ 5.2 Claimants, who are employed by or have a direct contract with the Contractor, have sent a Claim to the Surety (at the address described in Section 13).

§ 6 If a notice of non-payment required by Section 5.1.1 is given by the Owner to the Contractor, that is sufficient to satisfy a Claimant's obligation to furnish a written notice of non-payment under Section 5.1.1.

§ 7 When a Claimant has satisfied the conditions of Sections 5.1 or 5.2, whichever is applicable, the Surety shall promptly and at the Surety's expense take the following actions:

§ 7.1 Send an answer to the Claimant, with a copy to the Owner, within sixty (60) days after receipt of the Claim, stating the amounts that are undisputed and the basis for challenging any amounts that are disputed; and

§ 7.2 Pay or arrange for payment of any undisputed amounts.

§ 7.3 The Surety's failure to discharge its obligations under Section 7.1 or Section 7.2 shall not be deemed to constitute a waiver of defenses the Surety or Contractor may have or acquire as to a Claim, except as to undisputed amounts for which the Surety and Claimant have reached agreement. If, however, the Surety fails to discharge its obligations under Section 7.1 or Section 7.2, the Surety shall indemnify the Claimant for the reasonable attorney's fees the Claimant incurs thereafter to recover any sums found to be due and owing to the Claimant.

§ 8 The Surety's total obligation shall not exceed the amount of this Bond, plus the amount of reasonable attorney's fees provided under Section 7.3, and the amount of this Bond shall be credited for any payments made in good faith by the Surety.

§ 9 Amounts owed by the Owner to the Contractor under the Construction Contract shall be used for the performance of the Construction Contract and to satisfy claims, if any, under any construction performance bond. By the Contractor furnishing and the Owner accepting this Bond, they agree that all funds earned by the Contractor in the performance of the Construction Contract are dedicated to satisfy obligations of the Contractor and Surety under this Bond, subject to the Owner's priority to use the funds for the completion of the work.

§ 10 The Surety shall not be liable to the Owner, Claimants or others for obligations of the Contractor that are unrelated to the Construction Contract. The Owner shall not be liable for the payment of any costs or expenses of any Claimant under this Bond, and shall have under this Bond no obligation to make payments to, or give notice on behalf of, Claimants or otherwise have any obligations to Claimants under this Bond.

§ 11 The Surety hereby waives notice of any change, including changes of time, to the Construction Contract or to related subcontracts, purchase orders and other obligations.

§ 12 No suit or action shall be commenced by a Claimant under this Bond other than in a court of competent jurisdiction in the state in which the project that is the subject of the Construction Contract is located or after the expiration of one year from the date (1) on which the Claimant sent a Claim to the Surety pursuant to Section 5.1.2 or 5.2, or (2) on which the last labor or service was performed by anyone or the last materials or equipment were furnished by anyone under the Construction Contract, whichever of (1) or (2) first occurs. If the provisions of this Paragraph are void or prohibited by law, the minimum period of limitation available to sureties as a defense in the jurisdiction of the suit shall be applicable.

§ 13 Notice and Claims to the Surety, the Owner or the Contractor shall be mailed or delivered to the address shown on the page on which their signature appears. Actual receipt of notice or Claims, however accomplished, shall be sufficient compliance as of the date received.

§ 14 When this Bond has been furnished to comply with a statutory or other legal requirement in the location where the construction was to be performed, any provision in this Bond conflicting with said statutory or legal requirement shall be deemed deleted herefrom and provisions conforming to such statutory or other legal requirement shall be deemed incorporated herein. When so furnished, the intent is that this Bond shall be construed as a statutory bond and not as a common law bond.

§ 15 Upon request by any person or entity appearing to be a potential beneficiary of this Bond, the Contractor and Owner shall promptly furnish a copy of this Bond or shall permit a copy to be made.

§ 16 Definitions

§ 16.1 Claim. A written statement by the Claimant including at a minimum:

- .1 the name of the Claimant;
- .2 the name of the person for whom the labor was done, or materials or equipment furnished;
- .3 a copy of the agreement or purchase order pursuant to which labor, materials or equipment was furnished for use in the performance of the Construction Contract;
- .4 a brief description of the labor, materials or equipment furnished;
- .5 the date on which the Claimant last performed labor or last furnished materials or equipment for use in the performance of the Construction Contract;
- .6 the total amount earned by the Claimant for labor, materials or equipment furnished as of the date of the Claim;
- .7 the total amount of previous payments received by the Claimant; and
- .8 the total amount due and unpaid to the Claimant for labor, materials or equipment furnished as of the date of the Claim.

§ 16.2 Claimant. An individual or entity having a direct contract with the Contractor or with a subcontractor of the Contractor to furnish labor, materials or equipment for use in the performance of the Construction Contract. The term Claimant also includes any individual or entity that has rightfully asserted a claim under an applicable mechanic's lien or similar statute against the real property upon which the Project is located. The intent of this Bond shall be to include without limitation in the terms "labor, materials or equipment" that part of water, gas, power, light, heat, oil, gasoline, telephone service or rental equipment used in the Construction Contract, architectural and engineering services required for performance of the work of the Contractor and the Contractor's subcontractors, and all other items for which a mechanic's lien may be asserted in the jurisdiction where the labor, materials or equipment were furnished.

§ 16.3 Construction Contract. The agreement between the Owner and Contractor identified on the cover page, including all Contract Documents and all changes made to the agreement and the Contract Documents.

§ 16.4 Owner Default. Failure of the Owner, which has not been remedied or waived, to pay the Contractor as required under the Construction Contract or to perform and complete or comply with the other material terms of the Construction Contract.

§ 16.5 Contract Documents. All the documents that comprise the agreement between the Owner and Contractor.

§ 17 If this Bond is issued for an agreement between a Contractor and subcontractor, the term Contractor in this Bond shall be deemed to be Subcontractor and the term Owner shall be deemed to be Contractor.



STANDARD MANDATORY NOTICE AND CONSENT PROVISIONS FOR ALL COUNTY INFORMATION SYSTEM USER AGREEMENTS

The intent of this document is to provide notice that Tippecanoe County (“County”) information systems are to be used for County purposes and are subject to inspection by County officials and are subject to various security protocols. County employees do not have an expectation of privacy with respect to information that falls outside the scope of their employment with the County.

By signing this document, you acknowledge and agree that when you access County information technology (IT) equipment (including any devices attached physically or wirelessly to this information equipment), you are accessing a system belonging to Tippecanoe County and supported by the Tippecanoe County Department of Information Technology (“Department”). The system is provided for Tippecanoe County Government use only and you consent to the following as conditions of accessing the system:

1. The County routinely intercepts and monitors communications on the information system for purposes including, but not limited to: penetration testing, communications security monitoring, network operations and defense, detection of personnel misconduct, law enforcement, and investigations.
2. The County may inspect and seize data stored on this information system at any time.
3. To ensure a more safe and secure information technology environment, the Department reserves the right to refuse support, installation, or network use of a product that has not been pre-approved by the appropriate staff member. A request for changes to the network must be submitted at least one week prior to the change.
4. Security measures (e.g. authentication and access controls) on the information system are intended for the benefit of County interests. Such measures should not be regarded as being intended for the personal benefit or privacy of the user.
5. You recognize that information on the system is subject to Indiana’s Access to Public Records Act and may be disclosable to members of the public in response to a request for public records.
6. This agreement is not intended as a waiver of privilege with respect to communications or data protected by privileges related to personal representation or services provided by attorneys, psychotherapists, clergy, or their assistants. This non-waiver of privilege is, however, subject to the following:
 - a. Regardless of applicable privilege or confidentiality, the County may take such action as it deems necessary for communications security and for network administration, operation, protection, or defense.
 - b. All communications and data may be captured or intercepted by the Department for authorized purposes such as detection of personnel misconduct and law enforcement purposes. However, by consent to capture or interception of the communications or data,

the user does not otherwise consent to the use by the County or others of such privileged communications in personnel misconduct proceedings, law enforcement, investigations, or otherwise. The consent to capture or interception is not intended to negate any privilege or confidentiality that otherwise applies.

c. Whether any particular communication or data qualifies for privilege or confidentiality protections is to be determined by established legal standards and County policy. Users are encouraged to seek personal legal counsel on such matters prior to using a County information system if the user intends to rely on legal privilege or confidentiality protections.

d. Users should take reasonable steps to identify communications or data the user believes are entitled to such privilege or confidentiality protections. However, the user's identification or assertion of privilege or confidentiality protections does not create such protection where none otherwise exist.

e. A user's failure to take reasonable steps to identify communications or data entitled to privilege or confidentiality protections does not constitute a waiver if the privilege or protection otherwise exist under established legal standards and County policy. However, in such cases, the County is authorized to take reasonable actions as are necessary to identify whether the communications or data is entitled to privilege or protection. These actions by the County are not intended as a waiver to the applicable privilege or protection.

f. The measures outlined herein are intended to preserve any privacy, privilege and confidentiality protections conferred under established legal standards and County policy. The County shall take reasonable measures to protect the content of captured/seized privileged communications and data to ensure they are appropriately protected.

7. Unless the user is entitled to privilege or confidentiality protection as outlined above with respect to communications or data, the County may, at its sole discretion and in accordance with County Policy, elect to exercise the County's own privilege or discretion, as applicable, with respect to use or disclosure of such communications or data.

8. The provisions set forth herein apply regardless of whether the access or use of the information system includes the display of a Notice and Consent Banner. The Banner functions as a reminder of the provisions set forth herein and does not serve to modify these provisions. In the event of a conflict between a Banner and these provisions, the provisions set forth herein shall govern.

Memorandum of Understanding

The Board of Commissioners of Tippecanoe County,

Purdue University and

One-to-One Health, Inc. (d/b/a the Protect Purdue Health Center)

Date: August ____, 2020

This Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) is entered into among (i) Tippecanoe County, Indiana, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners and the Tippecanoe Health Officer (hereafter referred to as “County”), (ii) The Trustees of Purdue University (hereafter referred to as “Purdue”), and (iii) One-to-One Health, Inc. d/b/a the Protect Purdue Health Center (“PPHC”). In consideration of the mutual understandings and covenants set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to establish a public health collaboration among County, PPHC and Purdue through which Purdue and PPHC will be authorized by the County: (i) to perform certain contact tracing activities on students, faculty, and staff who live, study and/or work on Purdue’s campus in West Lafayette or on other Purdue property in Tippecanoe County (collectively, the “Purdue Community”), and (ii) to refer to the County all High-Risk Contacts (as defined herein) who are not members of the Purdue Community but who have been present on Purdue’s campus or property, and who, in each case, are believed or suspected to have been exposed to COVID-19. Purdue and PPHC shall coordinate and act on the behalf of the County when conducting these activities in accordance with the terms of this MOU.

II. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This MOU shall become effective August 15, 2020, and terminate on August 14, 2021. This MOU may be extended prior to the termination date or renewed after the termination date upon mutual agreement of the parties.

III. PROVISIONS

A. In the spirit of the parties’ mutual collaboration and cooperation to advance the above-described purpose, the County shall:

1. Permit Purdue and PPHC to perform contact tracing on members of the Purdue Community who reside in Tippecanoe County, including on Purdue’s West Lafayette campus.
2. Upon receipt of the list described in Paragraph III.B.2. of this MOU, provide comprehensive contact tracing notifications and other related services to those High Risk Contacts (as defined herein) who are not members of the Purdue Community. Such notifications and services shall be consistent with those provided by the County to residents of Tippecanoe County generally. The parties do not intend this provision to require a different level of notification or service by the County for individuals identified under this provision.

3. Provide a mechanism to receive and share contact tracing data.
4. Safeguard and protect the confidentiality of Purdue Community members and their protected health information by adhering to all laws, regulations, and County policies related to data or information acquired from Purdue or otherwise through contact tracing, including but not limited to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as amended (“HIPAA”) and the regulations promulgated thereunder.
5. Provide orientation on how to interact with the County on contact tracing as resources allow.
6. Provide orientation on the County’s contact tracing requirements.
7. Conduct periodic evaluations of the contact tracing activities conducted by Purdue to verify that all specified functions are being completed accurately, timely, and in compliance with County requirements.
8. Provide review and guidance assistance, when requested by Purdue, for activities relating to contact tracing activities and outbreak management.

B. In the spirit of the parties’ mutual collaboration and cooperation to advance the above-described purpose, Purdue and PPHC shall:

1. Conduct an initial contact tracing interview and identify all individuals within the Purdue Community with whom a COVID-positive member of the Purdue Community is believed or suspected to have had high-risk contact (“High-Risk Contacts”).
2. Provide a complete list of High-Risk Contacts to the County.
3. Provide comprehensive contact tracing notifications and other case management services for those High-Risk Contacts who are members of the Purdue Community.
4. Report any additional data and results of contact tracing to County as required by the County.
5. Provide to the County, on a daily basis, and without limiting any additional required reporting under paragraph 4, pertinent information about all new positive COVID-19 cases involving members of the Purdue Community that have been confirmed since the last report to the County, it being understood that Purdue and PPHC shall submit such daily report to County public health personnel via a secure portal that complies in all respects with requirements of HIPAA, including but not limited to the HIPAA “Security Rule.”
6. Safeguard and protect the confidentiality of Purdue Community members and their protected health information by adhering to all laws, regulations, and Purdue policies related to data or information acquired through contact tracing, including but not limited to HIPAA and the regulations promulgated thereunder.
7. Refer all High-Risk Contacts who are not part of the Purdue Community to the County for further handling, as described in paragraph III.A.2 of this MOU.

C. In the spirit of the parties' mutual collaboration and cooperation to advance the above-described purpose, County, Purdue and PPHC agree as follows:

1. The parties shall handle any Protected Health Information they receive or distribute in a manner consistent with the requirements of HIPAA or other applicable regulations.
2. The parties shall ensure that the responsibilities for the parties are met at all times and if not, shall immediately notify each other party.
3. All other regulatory responsibilities not delineated in this MOU shall be maintained by the Indiana State Department of Health, the County and/or other local health department.

IV. **AMENDMENTS**

No alteration or variation of the terms of this MOU shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto. No oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on any of the parties hereto. This MOU does not replace the applicable jurisdiction of the Indiana State Department of Health, the County and/or local health department authority to act upon or investigate public health-related matters, including without limitation, testing of drinking water and communicable disease investigations, as those governmental authorities deem necessary.

V. **TERMINATION**

Either party may terminate this MOU at any time for any reason by notifying the other party in writing. If this MOU is terminated for any reason, the parties will proceed as if this MOU had expired on its own terms.






