On Monday, planners met with the Stockwell Steering Committee for an hour at the Lauramie Township Trustee's Office to discuss the Stockwell Land Use Plan process. Mainly we talked about what was learned at the town-wide meeting on the 8th of November, and where we go from here.

Everything that was listed on the big pads of paper at that previous meeting was broken down into six different themes. We also talked through the many concerns brought to light on the 8th...some of which planning cannot help with and others that we can. (For example, "homeowners/not renters" is something we as planners cannot control; "no apartment buildings" is something we can control through zoning.) Everything that was said on the 8th is valuable and useful, but some are simply beyond the scope of a Land Use Plan.
